# DONNA ANDERSON KAM



Donna Anderson Kam is a visual artist based in San Francisco. Donna creates large scale works in pastel that investigate modern social issues and tensions. With her background in fine art, art history and design, Kam describes her works as "expressing moments in time through observations of culture and personal identity".

Kam sees our culture as one that is concerned with economic prosperity in spite of the consequences. Through media's relentless messaging, we are encouraged to consume as a way of defining ourselves, while the environment becomes filled with waste. Inspired by stories gleaned from news articles often relaying tragic current events, Kam directs and photographs young actors as they perform the stories, the resulting materials are used to create collage studies that are reinterpreted in pastel. Finely rendered scenes in vibrant tones are left intentionally ambiguous. The youthful figures allude to everything from fragility and peril to mischievousness and rebellion, and intimate that the issues that play out in the scenarios will continue to face future generations.

Anderson Kam's work has been exhibited in San Francisco, Los Angeles, Seattle, Minneapolis, New York and Washington DC. with solo exhibitions at Chandra Cerrito Contemporary, Oakland, California, and Recology San Francisco. Donna's work is in the collections of The Achenbach Foundation for Graphic Arts, San Francisco and Recology San Francisco.




